Jeremy Nedd & Impilo Mapantsula (CH/ZA)

"The Estatic"

Né à Brooklyn et basé à Bâle, le danseur et chorégraphe Jeremy Nedd réunit six danseurs interprètes internationaux de pantsula. Signifiant littéralement « le dandinement du canard » en langue zouloue, le pantsula se traduit, historiquement, par une insoumission à l'apartheid depuis les années 60, et artistiquement, par un jeu de jambes et des frappes de pied d'une vitesse époustouflante. Pendant les trois mois de résidence à Johannesburg, ils ont confronté cette danse des rues malfamées d'Afrique du Sud au *praise break*, une louange dansée et chantée jusqu'à la transe dans les églises pentecôtistes des États-Unis. Un collage contemporain de passé et de présent, de colonialisme et de religion, pour réinventer une histoire singulière, à vivre comme l'expérience esthétique d'une poésie physique, entre catharsis et extase.

Note d'intention (ENGLISH)

"The Ecstatic"

Pantsula, a historically significant South African subculture. Expressed not only as a powerful dance form which is well known for its high-speed virtuosic footwork, but also evident through a dress code, language, music, and a particular philosophy of life that is all its own. An expression that during Apartheid gave a voice to a whole generation. Praise Break, a mode of praise. A moment... a pause... a break in the context of the Christian Pentecostal Church service, where the dancing body, voice and music energetically coalesce and as a result blur the difference between ecstatic and cathartic. What happens when the aesthetics of these two worlds converge? What happens in this transcendental moment of a "break". Within the piece The Ecstatic, six Pantsula dancers turn to the motions that lead up to the praise break in order to find out, and "break open" a new space all their own.

«This work was born out of a three month residency in Johannesburg and a desire to understand why would (or in some cases must) one resort to an ecstatic state.

With that said my intention was to take the moment of "Praise Break" from the African American Pentecostal church as an emblem for community and catharsis for certain Black communities in the U.S.; and Pantsula, representing also an operation of community and catharsis for certain Black communities of South Africa, and to put them in what I felt could be an affective proximity with each other in order to explore what altered states of consciousness, exhaustion, coping and healing could represent and reveal in relation to the black experience.

Though my interest in putting Pantsula and Praise Break in proximity has surface level associations around "Footwork", the connections that I felt existed between the two went much deeper, especially when examining the intersections that exist, past and present, between Religion, Colonial Histories and Black Bodies.

Acknowledging those intersections, but not to be narrowed down to them, I hope the work highlights that which somehow managed to manifest itself despite tragedy, without giving tragedy center stage. My interest is in acknowledging how out of the shared space tragic histories, beauty and virtuosity manifested as by-products separately, yet similarly and somehow complementary. I feel the work that came to be is a contemporary collage where moments of virtuosic precision, physical and sonic poetry and a manifestation of the ecstatic come together and create aesthetic experience all its own.»

Jeremy Nedd is a Brooklyn born, Basel based choreographer and performer. His work focuses on the processes of dissecting, demystifying and re-contextualizing content in order to confront definitions of validity and contemporaneity.

Nedd has choreographed and presented his own productions at spaces such as ROXY Birsfelden, Tanzhaus Zürich, Arsenic, Münchner Kammerspiele and Palais de Tokyo amongst others. Nedd is a 2017 PREMIO Finalist (Nachwuchspreis für Theater und Tanz Schweiz), the 2017 recipient of the Atelier Mondial Stipendium to South Africa. Most recently Nedd completed a Master in Expanded Theater at Hochschule der Künste Bern, and was a part of Performancepreis Schweiz 2018.

Impilo Mapantsula is a global network of high-level professional dance artists who specialize in pantsula, a South African urban dance form. They are a professional organization that promotes the development of pantsula dance and culture, creates formal standards, and acts as an industry representative. The organization aims to document and protect the living legacy of pantsula and support dancers in professionalizing and further developing their art. Impilo Mapantsula creates learning opportunities and supports artistic creation and self-expression through educational, artistic and professional programs, with an emphasis on job creation, international collaborations and exchange programs.
